We are excited to be planning activities around the theme of 'You, Me and Everyone' and of course, Christmas. Our curriculum is planned to promote each child's learning through a range of varied activities following the areas of learning which are Communication and Language; Personal, Social and Emotional development; Physical development; Knowledge of the world; Mathematics; Expressive Art and Design and Literacy.

This is what your child will be looking at each week:-

Week 1: Touch / Bonfire Night

Week 2: When I grow up/ Remembrance Day / Children In Need

Week 3: My Body

Week 4: My Favourite Things/Thanksgiving

Week 5: Celebrating Christmas and St Andrew's Day

Week 6: Celebrating Christmas Week 7: Celebrating Christmas

Ideas for you to promote your child's learning at home are:

- Talk about all the people in your family and put them in order of tallest and smallest.
- See if your child can name a range of body parts
- Have a chat with your child about how people help us at the shops, in a library, in the Doctors' etc.
- Bake some cookies and let your child knead and roll the dough and make their own shapes - give the shapes names - triangle, circle, square.
- Have a trip to the Library in Didcot together and choose some books about these topics.
- Look at the Christmas songs and sing them together with your child to help them become familiar with the words
- Go on a sensory walk, crunch the leaves, smell the air, find conkers, acorns, pine cones and feel the textures. Suggest some new language (prickly, smooth, knobbly, rough, etc). Count what you find.
- Make a bird feeder and think about habitats and hibernation.

Let us know what else you do, and share your ideas with us. It's great to work together on your child's learning journey.

This is going very well and provides a lovely opportunity for children to practice their skills in sharing and talking about something special of interest for them with the group. It is especially important in developing a child's language, being able to ask questions to clarify their knowledge, practice sentence structure and learn new vocabulary. It is always helpful if the item relates to the WEEKLY THEME, as this provides a further opportunity to reinforce the learning, however we do welcome any item that the children wish to bring and share.

Flu - Winter Illness

We know that some of you have already taken advantage of the flu jab for your child, but we would like to suggest that anyone who has not arranged an appointment should now take up this opportunity. This year it is more important than ever for children to get their flu vaccination, especially those aged two and three. Flu can be serious for young children and they can also spread it further increasing the risk to those who are frail or vulnerable and at risk of serious complications if they caught the flu. The flu vaccination for children is a nasal spray that is quick and painless and all you need to do is book an appointment with your local GP practice for your child to receive it. Please may we also remind you not to send your child into Pre-School, if they have a cough, bad cold or a temperature. If your child needs Calpol in the morning, they are not well enough to come to Pre-School. Thank you for your help and consideration with this.

For Parents of Children going to School in September 2023

Parents of children, who will be going to School in September 2023, need to apply for a school place by the closing date which is 15th January 2023. Applications open online on 1st November 2022. It is important to apply by the closing date as applying on time is likely to maximise the chance of your children being offered a place at one of their preferred schools. Please make your application on line at: www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/primaryadmissions. If you are not familiar with the schools that you are considering, we encourage you to make arrangements to visit the school so that you can be sure this is where you would like your child to attend. There are planned open morning and evenings at Blewbury Primary School on Wednesday 2nd and Thursday 10th November 2022, 9.30am-10.30am and Tuesday 8th November 2022, 5.00 pm - 6.00pm, for all parents' who are interested in looking around Blewbury School. Your child's Key Person is happy to help you with any questions you may have about the school application process. You will hear of your child's school place on 17th April 2023.
